What are Opportunity Classes?

Opportunity Classes:

 cater for academically gifted Year 5 and Year 6 students with high potential



 help students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and educational materials at the appropriate level

Who are typically placed in an Opportunity Class?

Students who:

- consistently demonstrate very high to extremely high academic merit
- perform above the expected standard across the curriculum and receive
 A and B grades consistently.



Does your child demonstrate high potential, giftedness or talent in a particular domain of learning?

OC placements are well suited to students who demonstrate high potential, giftedness or talent in more than one domain of learning.

Signs of High Potential

High potential and gifted children tend to:

- be intensely curious
- learn new ideas or skills quickly and easily
- display a good memory
- ask complex questions
- be creative
- enjoy thinking in complex ways
- require fewer repetitions when learning new things
- become intensely focused in their area of interest or passion.



Is your child talented?

- Talented students are those whose skills are distinctly above average in one or more areas of human performance.
- Talent emerges from giftedness via a number of influences, including the teaching and learning opportunities.

In Summary

- Giftedness is about potential and talent is about demonstration of this potential.
- OC placement for HPG students aims to nurture potential through the domains of learning; intellectual, creative, social-emotional, physical.
- OC will target the learning characteristics in each individual student to give them the potential to achieve outstanding performance.

Is your child suited to an opportunity class?

Does your child:

- like to be challenged?
- demonstrate a rapid rate of learning?
- enjoy opportunities beyond the typical level of other children their age?

- How resilient is your child when they receive feedback about their academic performance?
- How resilient is your child when challenged by a highly competitive environment?
- Discuss your child's potential with their teacher

- Successful students attend the opportunity class full time in **Years 5 and 6** at a different primary school to Oakhill Drive Public School
- It is important to consider logistics of school drop off and pick up when considering the schools, you apply for.

- exciting to meet new friends
- exciting to have new and different challenges

Challenges of a new environment

- One size does not fit all
- Opportunity classes are very focused on the academics
- Highly competitive



The challenge of an OC Placement



- There are 75 OC classes across NSW offering 1700 placements in year 5, with over 11 000 applications to consider.
 - 15 % of the applicants are successful.

It supports every student to achieve their educational potential, through talent development opportunities and differentiated teaching and learning practices to ensure that their specific learning and wellbeing needs are met.

ODPS meet the needs of High Potential and gifted (HPG) students

This DoE policy states that:

 1.5.1 All schools have a responsibility to create learning environments that support high potential and gifted students to experience efficacy, agency and achieve their educational potential

How we support HPG students at ODPS

HPG students are supported at ODPS through.

- The Learning Support Team: HPG identified students are closely monitored to ensure they are continually challenged with tasks that *involve rigour and meet their unique needs*, e.g. real world related tasks.
- Differentiation: All teachers have the expertise to differentiate learning that challenges HPG students.

Supporting HPG students at ODPS

- Cluster Groups: We group High Potential and Gifted Students (HPG). Research shows HPG students need the opportunity to strive and learn from others whose perspective could enrich their own skills.
- Acceleration: provide and support access to acceleration or advanced learning pathways and opportunities.

Enrichment Beyond the Classroom

- Maths Olympiad
- Gateways Workshops
- Game Changer Challenge
- Tournament of the Minds
- Creative Arts Program: band, dance
- Representative Sporting Teams

Evidence of Success

- On average 5-10 year 4 students at ODPS are offered an opportunity class placement each year.
- 2019: 12 students offered a placement in a Selective High School and 5 additional students were placed on reserve lists.
- ODPS students are typically offered placements in High Potential and Gifted classes at Cherrybrook Technology High School.

Positive Education at ODPS

- Leading Positive Education school
- Holistic approach to education
- Areas in addition to academics are valued and nurtured.
- Explicitly teach the importance of relationships, resilience, optimism and personal strengths to support life-long learning.

Application & Selection Process

The OC Selection Process

- 1. Apply online before <u>5:00 pm on 7 May 2021</u>
- 2. <u>Placement Test: **Wednesday 21 July 2021**</u> (allocated testing centres)
- 3. School provides assessment scores
- 4. Parents receive correspondence from the NSW Department of Education regarding the success of their child's application.

OC Placement Test

- The 2021 Opportunity Class Placement Test has been designed to allow students to demonstrate their abilities across a range of areas, including; reading, mathematical reasoning and thinking skills.
- The test will continue to be paper-based.



Test Structure

The test consists of three sections and is structured as follows:

Section	Minutes	Questions	Туре
Reading	30	25	Multiple choice
Mathematical reasoning	40	35	Multiple choice

The Reading Test

- 25 questions
- 30 minutes completion time
- assesses a range of reading skills
- questions are based on different genres such as non-fiction, fiction, poetry, magazine articles and reports



Mathematical Reasoning Test

- consists of 35 questions
- 40 minutes completion time
- multiple choice
- assesses the student's ability to apply mathematical understanding and knowledge to problems
- questions will relate to many content areas of Maths





Thinking Skills Test

- consists of 30 questions
- 30 minutes to complete the test
- multiple choice
- assesses the student's ability in critical thinking and problem solving





School Assessment

NSW primary schools give school assessment scores to show each student's achievement in English and mathematics in 2021 relative to other candidates from the same school.

At ODPS, we use the following criteria:

- report grades for English and Maths
- standardised test results (eg. Progressive Achievement Tests in reading and numeracy)
- on going, in-class assessment



Placement Scores

- The placement score is calculated by adding the scaled test scores to the school assessment scores.
- The calculated placement score will be out of a total of 120 (previously 300). For most students, the calculated placement score determines offers of placement.



Scaling of Scores

- The entry score required for each school varies from year to year as the score is dependent on the number and the academic merit of students who have chosen the school each year.
- The scaling of the test marks is done on a state-wide basis regardless of the schools attended by the students. Each scaled test component is adjusted so they are weighted equally.



Test Score and School Assessment Scores₃₆

The calculated placement score is expressed as a **score out of 120** and is derived from the **test and school assessment scores** as follows:



- · Reading 33.3
- · Math reasoning 33.3
- · Thinking skills 33.3



School assessment scores

· English 10

· Maths 10

Total 20



Preparing for the Test

Department of Education does not recommend any specific coaching for the test.

Students are encouraged to;

- familiarise themselves with the test format
- practise sample tests and filling out answer sheets quickly and efficiently
