

#### **Dear Parents/Carers**

**Schools need a wellbeing leader: Sun Herald November 17 2019** Parents may have read a short article in Sunday's paper about the importance of having a coordinated wellbeing approach for the prevention and early detection of mental health issues of students. They gave the example of a program at St Catherine's, an Anglican girls school at Waverley. Oakhill Drive Public School has had a coordinated strategically applied wellbeing program based on positive psychology for several years. Our wellbeing program is taught explicitly by our classroom teachers and is integrated across Key Learning Areas. Our students are taught about and identify their character strengths, a growth mindset, healthy relationships and goal setting. We give our students "a toolkit for resilience, that hopefully helps prevent mental illhealth" that Daisy Turnbull Brown, Director of Wellbeing, St Catherine's refers to.

#### **World Vision Sponsorship**

Our school community is showing kindness by giving to others. Last week we held a mufti day to raise funds towards our sponsorship of Richard, our World Vision child. Our students raised close to \$800. These funds not only support Richard, but his whole community. In addition, the SRC is making up a care package to send to Richard's school. His community has requested Maths resources, which will benefit the school. In the spirit of having fun, we had a Year 6 students verse teachers tug-o-war. Teachers were thrashed on several occasions, much to the delight of Year 6 and the other students.

#### Performing at the Anglican Retirement Village

Our Stage 2 and Stage 3 choirs and String and Brass Ensembles were scheduled to perform at the ARV this morning. The plan was that our students would walk up the road. However, as the morning unfolded, the smoke clouds grew thicker and thicker. Rather than walking, we were able to hire busses at very short notice, who transported our students. Our notes to families indicated our expectation around uniform for this performance. Pleasingly, most students had read the note. It remains the responsibility of each family to read and return notes to the school. We are unable to allow students to attend an event outside of school, without permission notes. Some students were disappointed this morning, when they were told they couldn't attend. We are unable to call every parent on the morning of an event to chase up permission.

Our teachers' welcome parents to assist in their classrooms to support learning. Especially so, with our younger students as they grow their independence. This is an important partnership between the school

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and parents. The research says that schools which promote partnerships with parents achieve better student outcomes. We thank all the parent helpers who support our students. With this position comes great responsibility and trust. Parent volunteers are reminded about the importance of confidentiality and to supress judgement about student performance and behaviours they observe. It is not the responsibility of parent volunteers to communicate with parents about their child or to make comments to parents about other people's children. As most of the volunteering occurs in K-2 classrooms, we are talking about children who are at the beginning of their learning journey. They deserve to be shown respect. Whilst our teachers have addressed the matter with individual volunteers, I feel compelled to mention it in the newsletter as well.

#### Safety for All:

#### Returning to School from Injury

Parents of students returning to school in casts, boots, crutches, slings etc must inform the school prior to coming to school. An appointment is required with one of the deputy principals, who will develop a risk assessment. This is to ensure the safety of the injured child in our classrooms, playground and during sport activities. Please do not send your child to school without having contacted us.

#### Safe Behaviour in Bathrooms

Some students like to play games in the toilets such as hide and seek, chasing etc. As a result of these chasing games doors are slammed. I have spoken with our students about my concern that a finger will get slammed and seriously hurt or that a door will bounce back quickly and hit someone in the head or face. Please help us, help your child to understand that the toilets are not part of the playground and no games are to be played in these spaces.

#### Sun Safety

With the warmer weather here, I remind parents and students, that students must wear their hat to school daily. Students who do not have a hat are restricted to play in the shade only. This generally being the COLA. Parents and carers may also consider applying block out to children at home. Children may bring their own block out to school to reapply, however they need to be taught how to do this by you and they can't share their block out with other children.

#### **Child Minding**

Our staff volunteer to mind students, waiting for the bus after school on a daily basis. This is not an expectation of the Department of Education. All students waiting for the bus or their parent to pick them up must walk directly to the basketball steps and wait with the teacher. Please ensure that your child understands this instruction. For their safety, we cannot have children waiting all over the school to be picked up. I thank you in advance for understanding this important message.

#### **Semester 2 Reports**

Our teachers are currently preparing to write end of year reports for you. These will be available from Tuesday 10 December on the parent portal. You will also have access to your child's class and band award records on the portal. Parents who wish to speak directly with the class teacher regarding their child's progress before the end of the year are welcomed to make contact, via the school office, to schedule a mutually agreeable time.

#### Planning for 2020

Planning for 2020 is well underway and as always it is critical that we receive information to assist us in this process. If you are planning on withdrawing your child/ren from the school at the end of this year, you must advise us in writing now. Also, please advise us in writing, if your child/ren will be late to start the new school year. It is a government requirement that we are informed of the school your children will be attending in the future. Also, if you have a child beginning Kindergarten next year or know of a neighbour with a child starting school, please ensure the school office is contacted regarding enrolment.

The media coverage of climate change activist, Greta Thunberg, not only helped raise awareness of this issue, but it has also instilled fear in many young people. Children around the world are feeling overwhelmed by the magnitude of the issue. They are getting caught up in a doomsday scenario and collective hysteria that is causing, what is now termed as 'eco-anxiety'.

Anecdotal reports suggest that children of all ages, even pre-schoolers, are being treated for eco-anxiety by healthcare professionals and psychologists fear that this may lead to a learned helplessness or hopelessness.

As parents and care-givers, it is important to understand how best to diffuse a child's anxiety relating to impending environmental disasters. Discussing the known facts and instilling hope will give children a clear vision for a positive future. Reassurance about what countries and individuals are doing, and what you can do as a family, will go towards helping curb the effects of eco-anxiety.

In this Special Report, parents and care givers will be provided with strategies on how to approach conversations on environmental issues that are age appropriate. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this Special Report, and as always, we welcome your feedback.

#### ELECTED POSITIONS:

Please note ALL Executive Committee positions are open for election and must be voted on at the AGM.

**PRESIDENT** – Sits on the Executive Committee and chairs P&C meetings. Prepares report for School Magazine/Report on the P&C. Very occasionally, addresses a gathering of the school community on behalf of the P&C (e.g. Kindergarten Orientation, Presentation Day). Is also responsible for overseeing the Canteen Sub-committee. Approximately 4-5 hours a month.

**VICE-PRESIDENT x 2** - Sits on the Executive Committee and stands in when the President is unavailable. Is also responsible for overseeing one of the P & C subcommittees.

**P&C TREASURER** - The Treasurer sits on the P&C Executive Committee and keeps financial records of the P&C activities including bank reconciliation and profit & loss statements. The treasurer looks after the reconciliation of all three sub-committees working with the P&C Sub committee book keeper.

Cheque signatory for all P&C accounts and is responsible for banking of income (excluding canteen, band and uniform income). Consolidates financial statements of sub-accounts and co-ordinates year end audit. Reports to P&C meetings twice per term. Time required is approximately 4 hours per month.

**SECRETARY** – Sits on the Executive Committee and is responsible for carrying out the administrative tasks related to the decisions of the meetings as resolved. The Secretary prepares all meeting agendas and is required to attend P&C Association meetings and take notes of the discussions in order to produce a set of minutes for subsequent distribution to members and for receipt, possible amendment and adoption at the following meeting. Further, the position includes receiving and tabling all correspondence as well as writing and dispatching outgoing correspondence as appropriate. The Secretary also issues notice of all meetings and maintains official records of the P&C Association such as the constitution, by-laws, rules of subcommittees, list of financial (voting) members, minutes and attendance book. Is also responsible for overseeing the Band Sub-committee. Approximately 8 hours per month.
