As the year draws to an end, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank you for the support you have shown our school in 2019.

## **External Validation occurred in Term 2**

Once during a five-year cycle, schools undergo an external validation of the evidence of their school self-assessment. Our school engaged in discussions with an external panel and had our self-assessments validated using the School Excellence Framework (SEF). The panel, determined the school's evidence supports their self-assessment using each element of the SEF. The leadership team and our teachers have strategically planned for excellence as described in the SEF since 2015. Our body of evidence indicated to us that we are achieving at 'Excellent'. This is what we submitted to the panel and on Tuesday 11 June 2019, the panel confirmed our decision by validating our school in the following areas;

Learning: EXCELLENTTeaching: EXCELLENTLeading: EXCELLENT

This achievement is only possible when educators have their students at the core of all decision making. Our strategic directions have a relentless focus on learning and wellbeing. Our staff believe it is our responsibility to provide the best possible school environment for our students. These results can only be achieved when a school is supported by its community. Not all public schools are the same. At this public school our parents support our goals. You attend workshops, parent teacher interviews and provide us with your feedback. Our NAPLAN results confirm our internal data, with over 70% of our students achieving in the top two bands in literacy and numeracy. Every year we see a growing number of our students successfully gaining places to Opportunity Classes (OC) and Selective High Schools. Our sporting teams and performing groups succeed in competitions and



eisteddfods. At this public school, we work together to provide the best possible environment for our students to learn and grow. Your voluntary school contributions, in addition to those of the P&C directly contribute to learning, by allowing us to employ teachers above establishment to support students at risk, and extend and stretch all learners. All teachers prepare personal development plans and set goals for their own professional development and are supported by expert teachers.

I also thank and acknowledge your support of P&C initiatives. Our P&C organise many fundraising activities throughout the year, which you support to supplement and complement our school's allocated Department of Education resources. These are extras above and beyond our state allocation. In 2019 the P&C supported our school with approximately \$50,000 worth of works. Some of these include:

- Ground improvements: Synthetic grass, fencing, concrete pathways, awnings and covered walk ways to classrooms
- Canteen Mural
- Air conditioning
- Student leadership program
- Yr 6 First Aid program

Oakhill Drive Public School is not like other public schools. At Oakhill Drive, your child gets more than a basic education. I'd like to thank all families who were able to assist us in meeting our goals in 2019.

#### **Class Formations 2020**

This procedure begins with the placement of students with the teachers who we believe will bring the very best out of these students. Every class must have a mixture of boys and girls and a mixture of ability groups. We also take into account their relationships with their peers. Teachers know if 'best friends' can work productively in the same class or not. Some friendships are best suited to the playground only. There are no guarantees that they will have their closest friend in their class. We ensure that our students understand this from now. We seek your support to reassure your children that they will cope with their new class setting in 2020. The placement of our students in the appropriate class with the appropriate teacher and mix of students is our top priority.

Whilst we consider academic results, more importantly we take into consideration students' social and emotional wellbeing. All classes offer a differentiated curriculum. This means that all classes will have mixed ability groups within them. Our learning programs are designed to meet the needs of each ability group.

Yesterday I spoke with our students about coping with change and about the 'butterflies in their tummy'. I reminded them that this is normal and that it will pass, as it did at the beginning of 2019. Help us to support your children for the new school year, by talking up this change and reassuring them, that they will make friends in their class and the teacher will be supportive of them.

## **Extending Students**

At Oakhill Drive Public School we offer the opportunity to extend our talented students by placing likeminded students in the same class, as a cluster. These clusters occur over several classes. This is offered to students from Year 1 to Year 6. These students are taught the same curriculum content, however the pace of the lesson is faster, and the repetition of content is less. The nature of the student is such that the teacher can offer more challenging activities for students to apply their knowledge to.
