Changes to School Development Days in 2021

At the commencement of 2021, there will be amendments to our School Development Days (SDD). These amendments will impact Terms 1 and 4, but will have no impact on Terms 2 and 3. As a result of the changes, we will no longer have two Staff Development Days at the end of Term 4.

The 2021 school year will commence with two Staff Development Days. Therefore, for students in Years 1-6 the first day of school in 2021 will be Friday 29 January.

Community Safety

Last week, a parent was hit by a car as they tried to cross from the medium strip at the bus bay towards Mensa Place. Thankfully, all parties involved are well. However, this could have been a very different outcome. I remind parents that great care is required on our streets for the safety of all.



It is simply not possible for all parents to park in Mensa Place and I suggest that you will need to park further away from the school. It is also not safe to call your children to cross the road from the bus bay to you. If you want them to cross independently they should use the crossing.

Complacency is settling in, with parents now using the bus bay to socialise, children are being allowed to play ball games and chasing games. Pre-schoolers are using the sign posts to swing around and last week I witnessed a student doing handstands on the medium strip! I remind parents to socially distance and urge you to leave the street as soon as you have connected with your children.

There is an increase in the number of dogs being bought to wait in bus bay with their owners. Dogs are unpredictable around other dogs, noisy children and traffic. I would suggest that you do not bring your dog into the bus bay area.

Please ensure that grandparents, who pick up your children are aware of this information. I thank you for your support.


If you are planning on withdrawing your child/ren from the school at the end of this year, you must advise us in writing now. Also, please advise us in writing, if your child/ren will be late to start the new school year. It is a government requirement that we are informed of the school your children will be attending in the future.

Minimising Risk of COVID-19 Transmission: Updated Advice for NSW Schools

- Schools should continue to exclude students and staff with even mild symptoms of COVID-19 and encourage them to seek testing immediately. Parents of symptomatic children will still need to provide evidence of a negative test result on their child's return to school.
- In the case of seasonal allergic rhinitis or other condition that presents similarly to COVID-19 and in the
 presence of continuing symptoms, the child will need a negative COVID-19 test result and a letter
 from their GP confirming that the child should be permitted to return to school. If the child's
 symptoms change from their usual symptoms, repeat COVID-19 testing should be performed.
- Non-essential adults should continue to be excluded from school unless involved directly in delivery of curriculum activities or health services. All teachers, coaches and volunteers should continue to ensure they maintain physical distancing during, before and after school or sporting activities.
- Good hand hygiene practices should continue to be supported along with the other measures outlined in the school and community sports COVID-19 Safety Plan.

Kindergarten 2021



This month on SchoolTV - Raising Boys

Many parents will attest to the fact that most boys are active, loud, rambunctious and prone to rough play, but this should not affect how a parent acts towards their son. Be careful not to pigeon-hole your son into sex specific behaviours or gender roles. The male brain is distinctly differently in its development. A boy's physical maturity is often at odds with his mental and brain development.



Societal beliefs about how to raise boys can sometimes influence their adult carers. Although we are not determined by our biology, it is a factor. It is important to support boys in their natural tendencies and nurture their strengths and abilities. Teach them the skills they need for their future and to develop a healthy identity. It is important for boys to have a role model they can connect with and acknowledge who they are. One of the most important determinants for a boy's development is how secure they feel growing up.

In this edition of SchoolTV, adult carers will gain a better understanding into some of the more complex issues relating to raising boys. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this month's edition, and we always welcome your feedback.

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.


