

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our thoughts are with the people of India who are currently experiencing a record jump of infections and deaths due to Covid 19. This is intensified with a critical lack of resources due to the scale of the population impacted by this health crisis. We realise that some of our own school community may be personally impacted and we extend our deepest hopes that this situation rapidly improves. We are currently researching any way that our school community can assist.

Parent Teacher Interviews

Parents being involved in the education process for children improves success socially and academically. This includes parents discussing school activities, helping with learning at home and maintaining ongoing contact with their child's teacher. Our parent teacher



interviews are an opportunity for parents and teachers to share their expectations of the student and discuss any concerns, making plans to work together to meet these goals. These conversations should continue throughout the school year, using the teacher's preferred method of communication, in order to support students to achieve. Over 90% of parents have arranged to meet with their child's class teacher over the next two weeks and we thank you for your active involvement and support.

Assessment Tools

At Oakhill Drive, teachers use a wide range of tools to assess what students know, can do and understand in order to plan for future learning. This week, all students in Years 4 and 6 are undertaking the Department of Education's 'Check In' assessment in reading and numeracy. This is an online, multiple choice assessment completed by students across the state. Similarly, students in Years 3 and 5 will complete NAPLAN from Week 4. In addition, teachers gather data from daily activities, observations and samples of learning to determine each student's level of competency. A wide range of assessment data is used by teachers to inform future lesson plans as well as to make judgements for semester reports. These reports will be available for parents via the Parent Portal at the end of Term 2.

For me, I look forward to new adventures, opportunities and more time with family and friends in the future, however I will always smile when I remember my years at Oakhill Drive.



Raising girls in today's modern world can be a difficult path for parents and carers to navigate. These days, girls are transitioning to puberty a lot earlier than they used to and the physical, psychological and emotional changes they experience are challenging. As a result, by mid-adolescence, girls are twice as likely to develop mood disorders more so than boys.



Some parents and carers may feel uncertain about how best to support their daughter through the ups and downs of adolescence and how to keep the lines of communication open. With the rise of social media and technology, mental health difficulties in girls are increasing as often they are faced with online images that make it difficult to see themselves as acceptable. Ensuring a daughter's opinions are heard and her views listened to, will go a long way towards making her feel loved and supported as she tries to establish her own identity.

In this edition of SchoolTV, adult carers will attain a clearer picture of what girls are wanting from their adult carers and how best to support them through adolescence. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this month's edition, and we always welcome your feedback

Opportunity Class Application Information for 2022

Online applications for Year 5 placement in an opportunity class in 2022 opened on **Tuesday 20 April** and close on **Friday 7 May**.

Late applications cannot be accepted.

The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on Wednesday 21 July 2021.

Read <u>Applying for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022 External link</u> for information about the process and important dates.

Students are offered placement in opportunity classes based on academic merit. The results obtained from:

- reading, mathematical reasoning and thinking skills tests in the Opportunity Class Placement Test
- a ranking based on primary school assessments in English and Mathematics are combined to calculate an individual student's placement score. A selection committee is convened for each school with an opportunity class, to determine placement of students.
