Reporting to Parents

Teachers continue to prepare the Semester 1 reports for all students K-6. Students who are supported in Learning Support or EAL/D (English as an Additional Language or Dialect) will have an additional report. This report will detail specific learning goals that the student has been working towards.



At Oakhill Drive, our school reports provide information on what you child can do and their next steps in learning in each of the six Key Learning Areas (KLA). This semester, based on parent feedback, we have reinstated the 'effort' grade in all KLAs. We agree that it's important to acknowledge that a student may be putting in a huge amount of effort although their achievement grade may be lower; conversely, a student may not be applying themselves, taking risks or using feedback and although doing well, the teacher considers they could do even better. The report also outlines important dispositions to become self-regulated lifelong learners who can maintain positive relationships in the 'social development' and 'commitment to learning' sections.

Parents/carers will be able to access all reports on the Parent Portal. We anticipate that these reports will be ready in the portal in Week 10 of this term. Please check your access to the parent portal – instructions follow later in the newsletter - and contact the school if you are having any problems.

Raising Girls



Raising girls in today's modern world can be a difficult path for parents and carers to navigate. These days, girls are transitioning to puberty a lot earlier than they used to and the physical, psychological and emotional

changes they experience are challenging. As a result, by midadolescence, girls are more than twice as likely to develop mood disorders than boys.

Some parents and carers may feel uncertain about how best to support their daughter through the ups and downs of adolescence and how to keep the lines of communication open. With the rise of social media and technology, mental health difficulties in girls are increasing as often they are faced with online images that make it difficult to see themselves as acceptable. Ensuring a daughter's opinions are heard and her views listened to, will go a long way towards making her feel loved and supported as she tries to establish her own identity.

Safety after school

We extend our thanks to all parents/carers who pick up their children promptly at the end of the school day. Parents are welcome to wait on the basketball court and grass area to meet their children. Students must wait for their parents on the school grounds – not outside on the footpath – for their parents.

All students who are waiting for the buses which arrive at 3:15pm and 3:30pm must wait with the duty teacher on the basketball court steps. These students must not leave the school grounds until the teacher walks them to the bus.

Any students who are waiting for their parents/carers must also wait on the basketball court steps where they are supervised by the duty teacher. Students who have not been picked up by the time the last bus goes, will be taken to the office and parents contacted. Parents will need to pick up their children from the office if arriving after 3:30pm.

AEDC Survey

This year, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census. Please look out for the information note which will come home soon.

Uniform Shop

The Uniform Shop will be trialling a new booking system over the next few months and is **open EVERY Wednesday from 8:30am to 9:30am** ONLY to those parents/guardians who have a pre-booked appointment time slot/s booked through the <u>www.schoolinterview.com.au</u> website.

Please note that unfortunately, if you have not booked an appointment you will not be accommodated, as appointments will be in 5-minute time slots to allow for a flow of customers - without the need for lining up. Appointments can be used for all purchases, swaps, returns or trying on garments.

The Uniform Shop is able to accommodate 1 adult in each time slot which is indicated by '<u>Change</u> room 1' on the app. You may bring your child/ren to try on uniforms for accurate sizing. If you are purchasing uniforms for more than 1 child, you will need to select more than one time slot.

To book (or change) your uniform shop visit time:

- Go to <u>www.schoolinterviews.com.au</u>
- Enter the event code **dqqnj** (this code is case sensitive).
- Enter your details ensuring you include your telephone number and email address.
- Select your preferred day and time.
- Bookings are for 5 minutes.
- Please scroll to the bottom of the page to click **GO** to confirm your booking which will be emailed to you automatically (please check your junk folder if you do not receive an email immediately).

Please ensure you follow the Covid safety plan when visiting the school:

- Do not come onto the school grounds if you are unwell or have cold or flu-like symptoms.
- Sign in at the gate using the QR Code via the Service NSW app.
- Maintain 1.5m physical distance.

Orders may still continue to be placed through Flexischools using the existing system that is in place for returns/swapping items ordered, by returning the items to the office for the attention of the Uniform Shop with a note detailing your child's name and class, the items you wish to swap/return and your phone number in case the Uniform Shop needs to call you. All items that are swapped will be sent to your child's classroom in the usual manner.

Dear Parents/Carers

School reports are currently being prepared and will soon be available on the Oakhill Drive Parent Portal.

Many parents have already registered on the portal using their email address and a password that they created. After checking access, no further action is needed until reports are made available.

Some parents have not yet accessed the portal. There are also some parents who did not previously complete their registration and they should start their registration process again, following it through to completion.

To access the portal, parents must have an email address registered with the school. If you do not have an email registered, please email the school on oakhilldr-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au with your current email address. There may be some family circumstances in which both parents may require their own access to the portal. This can be done if both email addresses are registered with the school.

Once you have an email address registered with the school you can access the portal by following these instructions:

- 1. Go to the Parent Portal <u>https://www.impromation.com.au/portal4parents/?schid=4604</u> (You may need to copy and paste this link into your browser)
- 2. Click on the **'Don't have a password? Get Registered'** link at the bottom of the portal signin page, then enter your email address
- 3. Parents with no current portal account or incomplete portal accounts will receive a 'Getting Started' email which will guide them through the registration process.

During the registration process, parents will receive an email with instructions and a default password to use initially. This will give access to the portal to allow them to set up their own password which will be linked to that email address.

Access the portal using own email address as the Username and newly set-up password.

For parents who have previously accessed the portal but have forgotten their password, please click on the 'Forgot My Password' link which will take them through a process to reset their passwords.

Please note your password in a safe place for future reference when accessing the portal.
